NPAC requirements for implementing NPA splits

The NPAC must be notified of all NPA-NXXs that will be split at least 30 days in advance. The service provider (LERG code holder) responsible for the NPA split must communicate NPA split information directly to the NPAC. The NPAC requests that all SPs e-mail the following information to assure a successful NPA split:

- The old and new NPA
- The affected NXX(s)
- The Service Provider ID (SPID)
- The agreed upon date to install the split into the system
- The start date of the Permissive Dialing Period (PDP)
- The end date of the PDP (If the original end date of the permissive dialing period is extended, you must provide the NPAC with this date change as quickly as possible.)

To assure the best quality of service, you must send your VeriSign CSS a copy (cc) of all e-mail notifications to NPAC.

The NPAC will modify all of the (previously ported) Subscription Versions (SVs) effected by the split to associate the new TN with the SV in the Permissive Dialing Period. Split information input may be rejected if there are any partially failed or sending SVs associated with the old NPA-NXX. All SVs must be active for the split to occur.
